At the late negotiations in this place a Treaty has been concluded with the Indians, in which they have ceded to the U.S. their claim to a tract of Country 10 miles wide, lying upon the Illinois, between Fort St. Louis & Chicago. — Also a tract of 5 leagues square at the mouth of the Wisconsin River. —

Please give my best respects to Mr. Mason, & to my Providence Friends when you see them, — & to all enquirers after me. —
