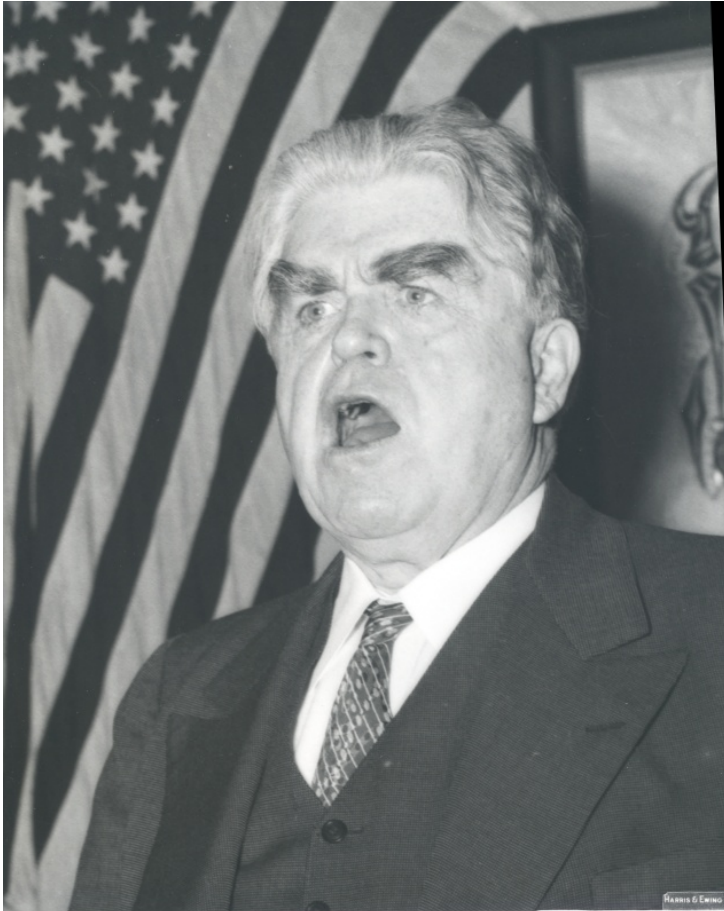


# John L. Lewis as he read to reporters his letter to members of the United Mine Workers ordering them to return to work
