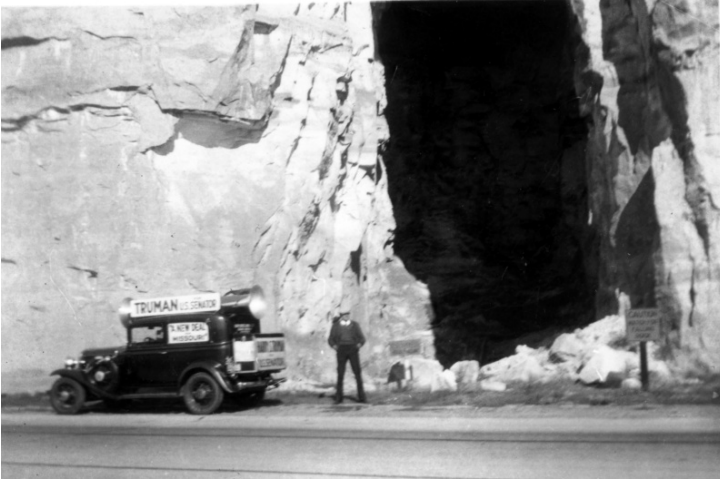


The campaign car parked beneath bluffs on Highway 66
