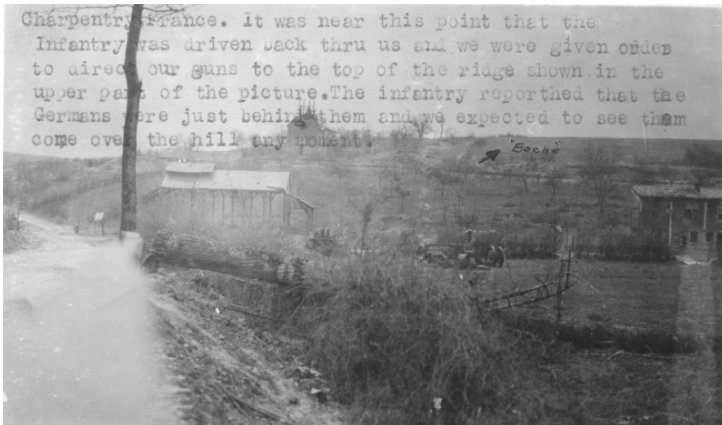


Charpentry, France
