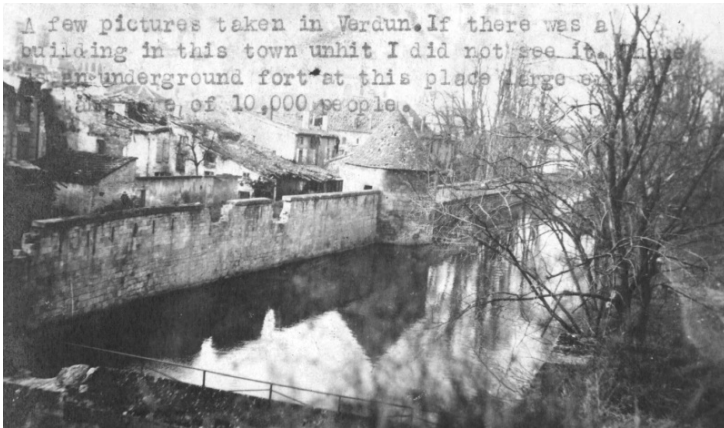


Verdun, France during World War I
