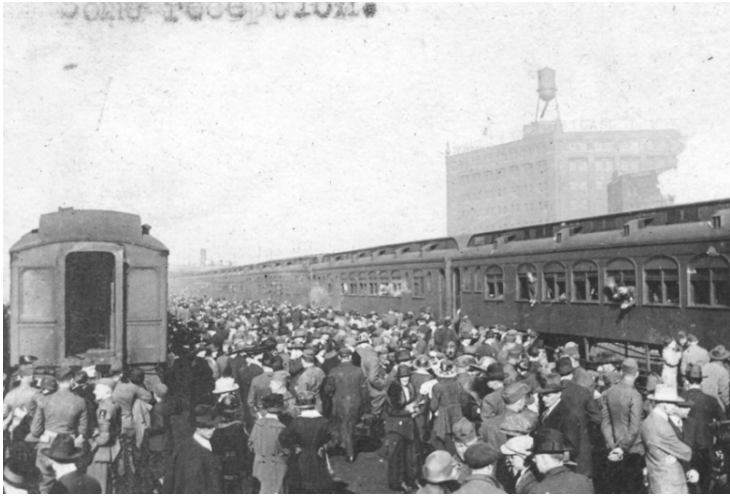


Members of 129th Field Artillery Greeted at Train Station on Route to Camp Funston
