

Low Water Bridge in Mark Twain National Forest in Missouri

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Description

Low water bridge in Mark Twain National Forest in Missouri will be underwater at flood stage. Gauges standing at both ends indicate that the bridge is safe for cars at a depth of six inches and one foot for trucks. Photos 2009-3080-01 through 2009-3080-107 were originally mounted in a leather bound binder with the gold embossed title, "Picture Memories of Region Nine." Region Nine, based in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, covered twenty states in the Eastern Region: Maine, Illinois, Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Indiana, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Maryland, New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, Vermont, New Hampshire, Delaware, and New Jersey. Lyle Watts was Regional Forester of Region Nine 1936-1943.
