

President Truman Smokes Peace Pipe with Chief First To Fly



Description

President Harry S. Truman meets with Native Americans on the rear platform of his train while on a Whistlestop tour in support of Adlai Stevenson's presidential campaign. He smokes a peace pipe with Assiniboinne Chief First to Fly (shown at right with horned ceremonial head gear) in Glasgow, Montana. Two years earlier, President Truman had been made "Chief Bear Soldier" by the Assiniboinne (*Hohe Nakota*) people. The other two Native Americans are unidentified.
