An American map titled "Newsmap for the Armed Forces: Monday, April 24, 1944." The map of the Eastern and Italian front shows railroads, rivers, international boundaries, areas under Allied control, battle lines, and points of Allied activity. The areas circled signify an Allied air attack on German rail centers, communication centers, aircraft plants, and airfield installations. The map of Crimea shows railroads, roads, battle lines, and points of Soviet advance. Printed text and photographs reveal news on multiple fronts. Printed text, drawings, and photographs on the back describe the importance of the use of smoke in gaining a tactical advantage.
