



No—we are the free born sons of america; the citizens of the only republick now existing in the world; and the only people on earth who possess rights, liberties, and property which the[y] dare call their own.





- Competition with Spain and Great Britain
- Alta California and Fort Ross
- Russian-American Company, 1812-41
- Fort Ross purchased from Russian-American Co. by John Sutter, 1841

### Diplomacy in Russia: Disaster and Suspicion

John Randolph of Virginia

- May-September 1830
- Jackson's Message to Congress

James Buchanan of Pennsylvania

- Must resolve Randolph's loose ends
- Convince Tsar Nicholas I to resolve dissatisfaction with Tariff of Abominations
- Encourage Russia about the future of Europe
- Determine Spheres of Influence







# Jackson, the fortunate successor?

- **Successor?**American shipping, regardless of origin of goods
- American extradition of defecting Russians
- Disadvantaging French trade
- Overlapping of spheres of influence
- An equal Russia and an equal United States

"The friendly relations which have always been maintained between the United States and Russia have been further extended and strengthened by the treaty of navigation and commerce concluded on 1832-12-06, and sanctioned by the Senate before the close of its last session. The ratifications having been since exchanged, the liberal provisions of the treaty are now in full force, and under the encouragement which they have secured a flourishing and increasing commerce, yielding its benefits to the enterprise of both nations, affords to each the just recompense of wise measures, and adds new motives for that mutual friendship which the two countries have hitherto cherished toward each other."
